

Chaperone Performance Ready Check List- All Choirs

HAIR--Make sure the hair is pulled back and out of the face. All fly-aways should be secure with spray, gel or bobbie pins that match the singer's hair color. All hair ties should also match the singer's hair color. A good indication of "concert ready hair" is to have the singer bow, her hair should look exactly the same after she returns to standing and her eyes visible.

NAILS--No nail polish. EXCEPTION. . . clear polish and French manicures (white tips, flesh colored nail beds) are okay if they are not noticeable.

BLOUSE-- Should fit over the top of the pants, above the hips.

PANTS-- Should be long enough to gently break over the top of the shoes. Should be approximately ½" off the floor in the back.

JEWELRY--No watches, bracelets, or earrings that will attract light. EXCEPTION: Small, non-shiny studs (i.e. pearls).

SHOES--All singers should have the correct shoes (peds are optional).

DRESSES-- Bodice should be comfortable, not tight. Length should fall midway between the knee and ankle.

CONCERT DRESS UNDERGARMENT (MANDATORY): Light to Medium control waist to mid thigh shaping garment (bike style) for the tummy, thighs and rear.

MAKE-UP--No make-up for Preparatory and Intermediate. Light discreet make-up for Apprentice and Concert Choirs is permitted.

RESTROOM RULES--Please make sure all singers have used the bathroom before the concert begins. If needed, schedule a break midway during the pre-concert rehearsal for a restroom trip. Singers need to remain in the audience and quietly watch the concert. Only emergency trips to the restroom are allowed and then singers should be accompanied by a chaperone at all times.

CHURCH ETIQUETTE--Please encourage the singers to act with respect to the church, the facility and the traditions of the church. Chaperones are to sit with the singers and encourage appropriate behavior. We are honored to be able to sing in such a beautiful venue and want to leave it exactly as we found it. 😊
